

LENT | This Year's Lenten Theme

During this season of preparation we are focusing on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples, Peter. Like many of us, Peter has a wandering heart. For each step in Peter's journey, a phrase from the hymn, "Come Thou Fount" has been selected. As we follow Peter's story, we will sing our way through Lent, binding our wandering hearts to God.

Lenten Experiences

- Stations of the Cross ~ Interpretations of the Stations of the Cross by our faith family congregants are displayed in the church sanctuary throughout the Lenten season.
- Prayers of Lament and Salt Bowls ~ Consider offering prayers of lament as part of today's liturgy. You may pour salt into the bowls of water before or after service, or during our prayers, as a symbol of our tears, heartache, and expectation of God's help.
- Resources in the Narthex ~ Lent devotionals, Lenten faith maps (for all ages), a calendar of events, and a handout explaining the message series logo are available in the narthex.
